The investment objective of the Fund is to maximize returns and achieve a high level of income for unitholders. The Fund invests primarily in global infrastructure securities.


The charts below give a snapshot of the Fund’s investments on August 31, 2016. The Fund’s investments will change.

HOW RISKY IS IT?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund’s returns change over time. This is called “volatility.”

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

RISK RATING

Sprott Asset Management LP has rated the volatility of this Fund as **low to medium**.

This rating is based on how much the Fund’s returns have changed from year to year. It doesn’t tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.


Like most mutual funds, this Fund does not have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

HOW HAS THE FUND PERFORMED?

This section tells you how Series A units of the Fund have in the past 4 calendar years. Returns are after fund expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Series A units of the Fund performed in the past 4 calendar years. The Fund dropped in value in 1 of the past 4 calendar years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series A units of the Fund in a 3-month period over the past 4 calendar years and to August 31, 2016. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

	Return	3 months ending	If you invested \$1,000 at the beginning of the period
Best return	9.62%	July 29, 2016	Your investment would rise to \$1,096.21.
Worst return	-8.74%	September 30, 2015	Your investment would drop to \$912.58.

Average return

As at August 31, 2016, a person who invested \$1,000 in Series A units of the Fund on its inception would now have \$1,330.46. This works out to an annual compound return of 5.94%.

WHO IS THIS FUND FOR?

The Fund is suitable for investors seeking the long-term capital appreciation potential of the global infrastructure sector, who want a portfolio which provides regular income and who are comfortable with a low to medium level of risk.

A WORD ABOUT TAX

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live, the type of earnings (ie, income or capital gains), and whether or not you hold the Fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your Fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series A units of the Fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales Charges

You have to choose a sales charge option when you buy Series A units of the Fund. Ask your representative about the pros and cons of each option available.

This sales commission is based on the value of units of the Fund purchased. The deferred sales charge is a set rate based on the original purchase price. It is deducted from the amount you redeem within three years of purchase. If you wish to reclassify all or part of your investment in Series A units of the Fund that were purchased under the Low Load Option to a series of units of this Fund that is not available under the Low Load Option, you will be charged a deferred sales charge at the time of reclassification, based on the date you first bought the fund.

2. Fund Expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the Fund's returns.

As of June 30, 2016, the Fund's expenses were 2.95% of its value. This equals \$29.50 for every \$1,000 invested.

Management expense ratio (MER) This is the total of the Fund's management fee (including the trailing commission) and operating expenses. Some of the Fund's expenses were waived. If they had not been waived, the MER would have been higher.	2.89%

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the Fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and his or her firm provide to you.

Sprott Asset Management LP pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the Fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate depends on the sales charge option you choose:

Sales charge option	Amount of trailing commission

Initial sales charge	1.0% of the value of your investment each year	\$10 each year on every \$1,000 held
Low load	0.5% of the value of your investment held by you for more than one year and less than four years	\$5 each year on every \$1,000 held

3. Other Fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the Fund.

FEE	WHAT YOU PAY
Switch Fee / Reclassification Fee	A fee of 0-2.0% of the value of the units you wish to switch or reclassify may be charged by your representative's firm, as negotiated with your representative.
Short-Term Trading Fee	We may impose a short-term trading fee payable by the unitholder to the Fund of up to 1.5% of the aggregate net asset value of the units redeemed if such units are redeemed within 20 days of their date of purchase or switch. For purposes of this short-term trading fee, units will be considered to be redeemed on a first-in, first-out basis.
Registered Tax Plan Fees	No fee is charged to open, close or administer a registered tax plan administered by Sprott Asset Management LP. However, for other registered tax plans holding other investments in addition to securities of a Sprott mutual fund, an annual trustee fee may apply payable to the administrator of the plan.

WHAT IF I CHANGE MY MIND?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities legislation in your province or territory.
